Round up of the week:

This week our children have been diving into the fascinating world of oceans and sea life. Through stories, songs and hands-on activities, the children have been learning about a variety of sea creatures and their habitats. They enjoyed counting fish, ordering numbers and exploring mathematical concepts through fun ocean-themed games. The children showed great creativity while making starfish, octopus crafts and giant fish artwork, as well as working as a team building a pirate boat and engaging in imaginative role play with their special treasure maps. We are very impressed with the children's drawing skills as they drew their favourite sea creatures.

Our investigations encouraged the children to think like scientists as they explored frozen sea creatures, experimented with sinking and floating objects and examined shells, sand and 'sea life' using magnifying glasses. The children were particularly interested in looking closely at the patterns, textures and colours they could see, developing their observation skills and curiosity about the natural world. We also learned about the importance of keeping our oceans clean and discussed simple ways we can help protect marine life. It has been a wonderful week filled with exploration, creativity, problem-solving and discovery.

Next week our theme is 'At the Farm' ready for our farm visit next Friday.



Outdoor Learning

Our outdoor learning this week focused on the exciting theme of Habitats. The children became nature explorers as they searched for mini-beasts in microhabitats, created homes for insects and observed stick insects and a giant land snail. They enjoyed making bird feeders, using binoculars to spot birds and learning about different bird species and their habitats. The children also explored the fascinating world of bees, practising the waggle dance, planting flower seeds and learning how bees help our environment.

This week we also celebrated World Oceans Day, exploring ocean habitats through exciting water play activities with sea creatures, creating underwater scenes using loose parts and playing fun shark-themed games. The children enjoyed discussing the different animals that live in our oceans and thinking about how we can help protect their habitats. We finished the week with a woodland habitat adventure, discovering woodland animals, exploring natural materials and learning about the different places animals call home. It has been a wonderful week of exploration, curiosity and outdoor discovery.



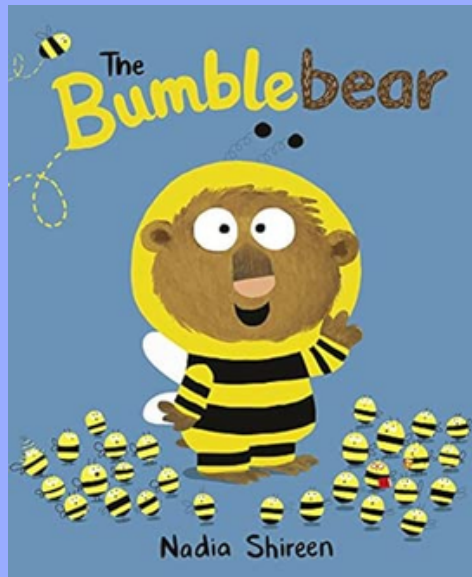
Value of the month:

It sends such a lovely message about being yourself and knowing that you don't have to change to belong”

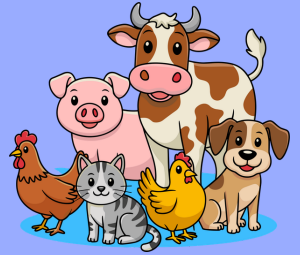

– School leaver children who weren't at preschool arrive

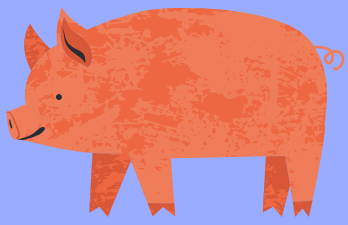
School Leaver children **stay in preschool**

Friday 19th June

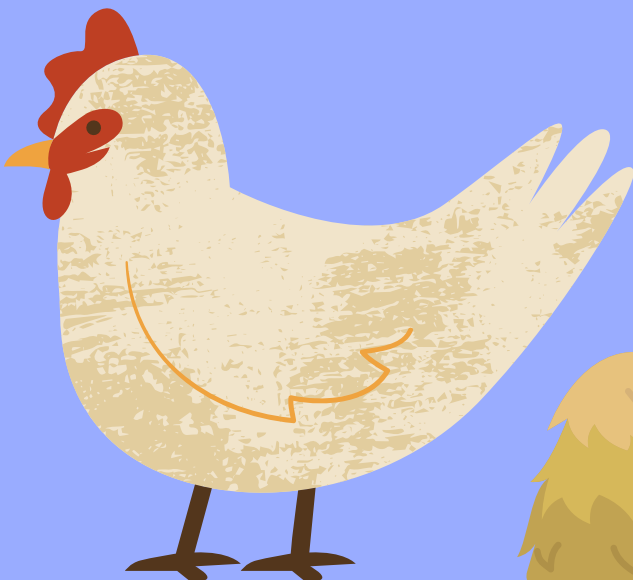


If your child usually attends on a Friday - we will take them to the farm in small groups.
