Round up of the week:

This week has been all about Bears, and we have loved linking our learning to some very well-known bear characters from our favourite stories. The children became familiar with Winnie the Pooh and his friends by exploring yellow, gloopy water to represent Pooh's famous honey. Through tipping, pouring and scooping, the children strengthened their hand and arm muscles – an important early writing skill – while enjoying lots of sensory fun. We had a very exciting day exploring Goldilocks and the Three Bears, with porridge oats absolutely everywhere! The children enjoyed role-playing the different characters, calling 999 and tracking down the cheeky Goldilocks. Through maths activities, the children rescued bears, counted them, sorted by colour and organised them into simple patterns. All the children repeated phrases, made playdough bears and went on a bear hunt! Our Paddington Bear day was a big hit, as many of the children were already familiar with the character. The children counted bears onto a London bus, created famous landmarks using wooden blocks and loose parts, made marmalade sandwiches, and got wonderfully messy playing with bears in "mud." Our final bear book was The Bear That Went BOO! The children practised mark making and writing the letters BOO on foil, enjoyed ice painting, and explored messy shaving foam to represent the Arctic home of the mischievous polar bear from the story.

Outdoor Learning:

Through rain, mud, blue skies and freezing temperatures, the children have fully embraced the wonderful outdoor area we have at Flying Start. The children enjoyed finding Winnie the Pooh's numbered honey pots around the garden and pegging them in order, as well as moving like Tigger, flying like Owl and running like Piglet. Our garden was transformed into a snowstorm, forest, mud swamp and river from We're Going on a Bear Hunt, with children reciting familiar phrases and discovering the bear's cave. We also had great fun making mud pies and painting with mud on giant boxes, helping to strengthen core and arm muscles needed for early writing.

Our value for this month is **Independence**. We encourage children to take responsibility for small everyday tasks. You can support this at home by involving your child in simple jobs, like helping to set the table or putting toys away after play.
